GUIDE TO THE AMOS ASHMUN TAYLOR PAPERS

Collection Description:

The Taylor Papers represent the accounts of a physician in Warwick, Mass. between the years 1816 and 1849. Born in Warwick in 1785, Taylor studied medicine with Elihu Dwight in South Hadley, Mass. In 1813 and 1814, he attended lectures by Eli Ives, Benjamin Silliman, and Nathan Smith at the Yale College Medical Institute. Taylor next settled in Northfield, Mass., where in 1815 he filed an intention to marry Polly Day of South Hadley. In 1816, he returned to Warwick and began a medical practice which would continue until c. 1856. Taylor served as town clerk from 1829-1837, and was for some period surgeon of a regiment of Massachusetts militia, resigning in 1830. Amos Ashmun Taylor died in Warwick on April 28, 1865.

The bulk of the collection consists of seven day books and one account book wherein Taylor recorded treatments of patients and attendant charges. He also was involved with the operation of a general store, possibly a cooperative. Two account books (designated A.A. Taylor & Co. but not kept in Taylor's hand) record the purchases of a variety of individuals – including Dr. Amos Taylor. Part of his medical training is reflected in two notebooks kept while attending lectures at Yale.
