

Hawks, Charles (1817-1864)

“Memoranda” book, 1843, 1847. Deerfield, Mass.

Listing of money received and expended, kept by a Deerfield farmer.

Charles Hawks moved to South Carolina sometime in the 1850s, and died there from typhoid fever. His memoranda book was continued in 1871, apparently by Dwight Allis Hawks (1848-1928), who made numerous references to transactions with his brothers. DA Hawks used the book until 1975. At the rear of the volume are notes in pencil of a religious nature, begun on Aug. 26, 1838, seemingly in the hand of Charles Hawks.
