Papers of the Franklin County Public Hospital School of Nursing

The first public hospital in Greenfield, Massachusetts, was constructed on High St. in 1910, and operated a training school for nurses. In 1927 a north wing and Nurses' Home were added to the building. A second expansion occurred in 1953, when a new wing was completed that brought the total capacity to 150 beds.
