Hawks, John (1707-1784)

John, son of Eliezer and Judith (Smead) Hawks, was born in Deerfield. He entered military service as a young man, and participated in numerous engagements until 1760. He also held several civil offices, including selectman. In 1730, he married Elizabeth Nims; the couple had eight children.
