1. Diary, June 1734-August 1735

Mss. 1 vol.

Possibly by a student at Yale. The journal primarily contains this person's thoughts about their religion, including, but not limited to their and other's devoutness to Christ, sins, and church.

2. Diaries, 1858-1859

Mss. 2 vol.

Memorandum of the weather, farm chores, harvesting. It covers the weather, farm chores, harvesting, geography, and farming-related events.

3. Diary of three in Amherst.
Sat, Oct 19, 1912

One handwritten sheet. It talks about a trip to Sunderland and Old Deerfield. He went with "Uncle" (who was [Allen?] B. Dogg[ert?]) and "Duke" ([who] was a Dartmouth graduate) (All of them went to summer camp together) and they took the trolley. They mention the weather being "misty, on the verge of rain. the rain came in AM". They went to the Old Deerfield Museum. Then they talk about how they ended their day.
